## ORCHARD THERMOMETER TESTING

National Weather Service will be testing thermometers Wednesday, March 7, 1990. Growers should bring in their thermometers by Monday, March 5th. Tested thermometers should be picked up by Friday, March 9th. New thermometer tags will be provided at the Farm Advisors office. Thermometers will not be tested without your name on a new tag on each one. The following instructions will help you complete preparations for testing:

- Remove thermometers from any containers.
- Clean thermometers of all old tags, dirt, cobwebs, etc.
- Transport thermometers vertically with bulb end down.
