ATTENTION: GROWERS!! FARM SAFETY UPDATE - SPANISH SESSION

On January 30, 1989 farm labor personnel will have the opportunity to be updated on the latest laws and regulations in their own language. There will also be a presentation on safe pesticide handling (including mixing, loading, and application) and a slide show on tractor accident prevention. Refreshments will be provided.

The new immigration laws have made your agricultural labor force a scarcer and valuable resource. Valuable means to be valued. I am asking all growers, especially those with permanent crew to encourage attendance at this meeting, even if it means paying them to attend. The Legislature, and thus CDFA, are only going to enact and enforce more laws and regulations, not less. The few hours of salary invested in worker education may save you hundreds or thousands of dollars in future fines.

Session I: Young, Terminal Bearing and Lateral Bearing Trees (e.g. Vina, Chandler, Tehama)

1:00 - 2:30 - Ed Suchan Orchard

Elk Mountain Road off Hwy. 20 (turn at Treasure Cove Pizza). On right side before first bend. Park at Suchan Nursery (at bend).

We will discuss choosing main scaffolds and other considerations for modified central leader trees.

Session II: Mature Terminal - Bearing Trees

3:00 - 4:30* - Chuck Manning Orchard

Elk Mountain Road to Pitney Lane, right turn to end of Pitney Lane - orchard is on right side.

We will discuss results from demonstration trees pruned in 1987, as well as prune more trees. Emphasis will be on remedial pruning.

* Time and daylight permitting we will also discuss deep bark canker and stress-related factors that are so prominent in orchards this year. Come with questions, notebooks, and pencils!

1988 PEAR RESEARCH RESULTS

The final agenda for the meeting scheduled for February 7, 1989 at the Mendocino County Farm Bureau in Ukiah will be mailed separately in early January.

Presentations will summarize progress and results of California Tree Fruit Agreement sponsored research: codling moth mating disruption via pheromone confusion, reduction of ice-nucleating and fireblight bacteria using antagonistic bacteria, "soft" or selective (IPM) control programs, miticide resistance and new miticides, russet control, and insect growth regulators for codling moth control.

For growers who cannot attend this meeting a similar program will be held January 26, 1989 , 1:00 p.m. at Consumnes River College in Sacramento County.
