The article was written by UC-educated Dr. Dan Strydom of South Africa, a noted horticulturist. It was presented at the July 1993 6th International Pear Symposium on Pear Growing in Medford, Oregon. Dan has given several PAB-sponsored pear training and pruning demonstrations in California. His last visit to Lake County was January 21, 1994. Hopefully, there will be a 1994-95 demonstration, in which case it may be helpful to have your pruning foreman read Dr. Strydom's article before attending the meeting.

When reading and discussing the concepts detailed in the article, it is important to remember that every year and every orchard is different. Dan's ideas, like any expert's, may or may not fit your particular situation. Before adapting a practice, try it out in a small area of your orchard. Of course, I would be happy to discuss any of the concepts or provide assistance analyzing your situation or practicing his techniques.

American Society of Enology and Viticulture (ASEV) sponsors periodic seminars and publishes complementary proceedings. The following are available:

Cover Crops: A Practical Tool for Vineyard Management \$25

This booklet was prepared for a Seminar held at the 44th ASEV Annual Meeting, 1993. Topics addressed include beneficial insects, in-row weed management, water relations, wine quality and cover crops and managing cover crops.

Proceedings - "Rootstock Seminar, A Worldwide Perspective" \$40

The Seminar, held June 24, 1992 in Reno, Nevada, featured international and domestic speakers who presented perspectives on current and historical rootstock use and selection. Issues such as rootstock resistance to pests and diseases, suitability to particular soil conditions, drought tolerance and vigor considerations are addressed in this publication.

Alternative Rootstock Update \$15

This booklet provides a general introduction to rootstock use and selection. This booklet was prepared for an ASEV workshop held in April, 1991.

Vineyard Pest Management: Alternatives for the Future \$15

This booklet provides a general overview of pest management with a discussion of Integrated Pest Management (IPM) and organic farming. Compiled for the ASEV workshops held in May, 1992.

Proceedings - "International Symposium on Nitrogen in Grapes and Wine" \$50

The Proceedings contain the keynote and poster presentations of the speakers at the June, 1991 Symposium. The role of nitrogen both in vineyards and the winery is discussed in the 49 scientific articles.

Each year there is an ASEV meeting. In 1994, the results of the rootstock trial at Kendall-Jackson Vineyards in Lakeport were presented. Research abstracts on this and many other subjects are printed in the Technical Abstracts and also recorded onto audio cassettes (two presentations per cassette, \$7.00). Finally, we have handouts distributed at the bi-annual Recent Advances in Viticulture and Enology (RAVE) Symposium at UC Davis. 1993 topics included a review of UC Davis departmental research, rootstock spacing for Cabernet Sauvignon, windbreaks, trellises

for San Joaquin Valley, potassium deficiency effects, breeding for phylloxera resistance and clonal evaluation trials.
